Lenten Message: 28 March 2021

During most of the year, we are to refrain from eating meat on Wednesdays and Fridays. However, fasting rules change when we move towards Holy Week. Good Friday is a day of Strict Fast. In our tradition, we are to sacrifice a quantity of food and certain types of food. We are asked to eat only one meal and to avoid meat, dairy, wine and olive oil. During Holy Week, we are also asked to avoid dairy, wine meat and olive oil. We can, however, enjoy vegetables of all kinds, bread, fish, non-dairy desserts and soy products. There may be those who cannot follow these rules due to age or for dietary reasons. Please see Father George if you have any questions. If exceptions regarding food are needed, there are other ways to abstain. A person can give up a favorite program, a fun board game, or alter one's daily schedule. The important thing is that we all participate in some way. This sacrifice prepares us to reject temptations to sin and to be prepared to welcome Christ at Easter and live a holy life.

PASTOR'S PULPIT OF THE GOSPEL

On Palm Sunday as presented in St. John's Gospel (12:1-18), Jesus enters Jerusalem riding on a donkey while many from the city praise Him shouting, "Blessed is He Who comes in the name of the Lord." Why are they praising Him on this occasion? The Gospel text reveals to us that the crowd knew that Jesus had raised Lazarus from the dead, so they were aware of this life-giving miracle. Their enthusiasm was directed at Jesus, a man with great power. In other words, Jesus spoke to their inner longings. They saw Him as the hope of all of the ages and the cry of every heart. The people understood that Christ had the power over life and death, and they could benefit from Him in their own lives. He was One Who might provide inner peace through the hope of eternal life. With all of this in mind, we should listen to the words of St. Paul in today's first reading. He tells us the following: "Have no anxiety about anything." It is true that this world presents us with many reasons to be anxious. Our financial, health, family and spiritual problems can create great distress. Will the mortgage payment be made on time? Will the cancer be treatable? Will the adult child overcome his irresponsibility? Can the besetting sin be conquered? Our anxiety is understandable, but also a bit misplaced. God loves us and has charge of us in all situations and we possess the power of prayer to aid us. We need to set all of our worries aside by giving them to our Lord. After we have offered our prayers to Him, we have done our best and can be tranquilly confident in His will. Once again, St. Paul, in Philippians (4:4-9) encourages this approach with these words: "...in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be made known to God. The Lord is at hand! He walks with us wherever we are, and the Holy Spirit is our comforter in all situations. So, let us be peaceful and grateful. We should be at peace and we should rejoice, because we welcome the Lord, Who rides into our lives this day, the same Jesus Who uplifts our souls! Blessings, Father George
