PASTOR'S PULPIT OF THE GOSPEL

We can rely on the promises of Christ. One of them is eternal life and our faith can lead us there. The theme of this week's Scripture is the work of the Lord in healing those who are sick. Indeed, Christ is the Great Healer! The Book of the Acts (9:32-42) tells us that St. Peter heals a man named Aeneas and brings a woman named Tabitha back to life through the power of Christ. St. Peter did so as a man of faith. In the Gospel of St. John (5:1-15), Christ heals a man who is paralyzed and who had waited for thirty-eight years with expectant hope that God would cure him. The paralytic endured great suffering; after all that time, he did not give up. What faith this paralytic must have had! Later, Jesus meets the paralytic in the Temple and tells him to sin no more. The man's physical cure was a sign that his sins were forgiven; the true evil is sin, not sickness. Christ, here, is focusing upon our entrance into eternal life. For those among us who suffer some form of illness, we can draw upon our faith. Pope Francis has taught us that: "There is not a cross, big or small, in our life, which the Lord does not share with us." Out of faith, we offer our suffering in union with the Cross as a means to holiness. What is keeping us from the promise of God that we will enjoy His Kingdom? What will help us to get there? Our faith provides a pathway. With faith, Peter healed Aeneas and Tabitha by the power of Christ. With faith, the paralytic obeyed Jesus and carried his mat, contrary to the Jewish law regarding the Sabbath of his time. Our faith informs us of the problem of sin so we can work to root it out of our lives. Sin is the greatest barrier standing in the way of Eternal Life. The Old Testament calls sin missing the mark so that we can't share in the prize. It is like an archery contest; if a person's arrow doesn't hit the circles on the target, there is no reward. Faithfully praying to the Holy Spirit for help in avoiding sin helps us to stay on course. Our faith and our opposition to sin should be matched by the pursuit of humility. Christ, Himself, tells us to learn from His humility. In our Gospel lesson, the Lord disappears into the crowd after He heals the paralytic. He withdraws to teach us to avoid worldly praise. We need to remember who we are in relationship with the Almighty; He is God, and we are not! The fulfillment of God's promise of eternal life is achieved when we have faith, avoid sin and pursue humility with the help of the Holy Spirit. The late-Francis Cardinal George of Chicago once stated that God is always with us, in good times and in bad, in darkness and in light, so long as we remain one in Him. And if we remain in Him, we will enter into His heavenly kingdom. Blessings, Father George
